**Purpose or Goal of the Class:**

As our world grows more complex, each individual has an increasing need to know both himself/herself and the world around him/her better. General Psychology is offered as an initial step in aiding each student to identify and become aware of variables that affect his/her own behavior and the behavior of others. The knowledge gained from General Psychology, when applied in individual lives, will allow the learner to become a more productive member of society. This course also will provide a broad foundation of fundamental principles for the learner to build upon through additional courses in the Psychology field.

**Objectives of this Course:**

The learner completing this General Psychology course will:

1. Gain an appreciation of the scientific methods of Psychology
2. Gain a readiness to apply those methods in his/her life.
3. Develop skill in evaluating popular accounts of Psychology.
4. Gain an understanding of the variables involved in behavior and how those variables are utilized in affecting behavior.
5. Gain an understanding of the major methods and tools used in the psychology field.
6. Through this understanding, when applied in the situation, the individuals will function in society in a more efficient manner. Also, a greater attitude or understanding of self and others will be gained to be utilized throughout life.
7. Gain a broad-based foundation of fundamental principles in the Psychology field from which to build upon with additional courses in the field.

**Class Activities:**

Activities to reinforce chapter content will be included in the scope of this course. Participating in discussions, lecture and class exercises, as well as analyzing writings and/or visual media along with conducting experiments will be expected of all students enrolled in the class.

**Quizzes:**

Quizzes may be given weekly to help with the readings and lectures.

**Service Learning Project:**

To fulfill requirements of this course, a minimum of 10 hours of service must be met through pre-approved activities at Springview Manor and Kyle Trueblood Elementary. A reflective paper will be written by the student and turned in toward the end of the semester.

**Midterm Exam:**

The midterm examination covers Chapters 1-7. Question format is multiple choice.

**Final Exam:**

The final examination covers Chapter 8-13. Question format is multiple choice.

**Extra Credit:**

Extra credit will not be offered in this course.

**Communication:**

Students will access their student Cowley C-mail account at <http://www.cowley.edu>, select *Check Email-Students* from the Quick Links drop down box (located at the top of all Cowley web pages), select the log-in link, and then input their username and password. The student’s username is their last name, the first letter of their first name, and the last six digits of their Cowley student ID number. For example, John O’Brien with a Cowley ID number of 999234567 would use OBrienJ234567 for the username and the initial password is Password1. The password is case-sensitive (the P must be capitalized, the remaining characters must be lowercase, and the final character is the numeral One). It is the student’s responsibility to check their Cowley C-mail account frequently.

Instructors teaching online, online hybrid, or using Blackboard to web enhance their face-to-face classes may also require students to correspond using the Communication Tools within their Blackboard course.

All student academic reports and current grades can be accessed through Campus Connect. Even though the Blackboard grade book may be used to help students track their academic progress, the official grade is posted in Campus Connect as well as Conway Springs High School’s Powerschool.
